

Going to the theatre is a special moment! To make sure everyone enjoys the show and respects the performers, the space, and each other, please follow these 10 simple rules:



Follow instructions from your teachers and the theatre staff.

They will guide you to your seat and explain what to do. Pay attention and be respectful.



2. Sit properly and stay seated during the performance.

Don't stand up, move around, or switch seats during the show.



3. Watch and listen carefully.

The actors have worked hard to tell you a story. Enjoy it with your eyes and ears!



4. Do not talk during the performance.

Even whispers can be distracting. Save your comments for after the show.



5. Don't clap while the actors are singing.

It's tempting, but clapping can make it hard to hear the lyrics. Wait until the song finishes!



6. Clap and cheer at the end of scenes or songs - if you liked them!

Applause is a great way to show appreciation. Feel free to clap when a number finishes or at the end of the play.



7. Join in if invited!

If the actors ask you to sing, answer, or participate – go for it! Just don't shout or interrupt unless they ask you to.



8. Do not use mobile phones or electronic devices.

Phones should be off or silent in your backpack. No recording, photos, or texting.



9. Keep your hands and feet to yourself.

No kicking seats, tapping, or bothering the people next to you.



10. Have fun and respect the magic of live theatre!

Theatre is a shared experience – enjoy the story, the music, the characters... and be part of the audience that actors love to perform for!
