- Let students draw, act, or sing to connect with words

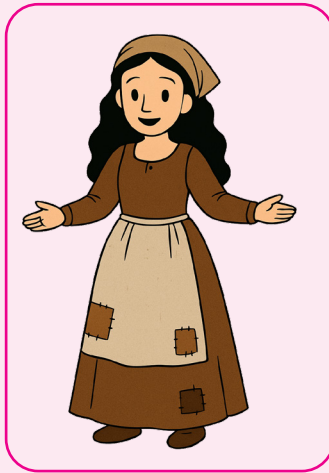

A place ruled by a king or queen

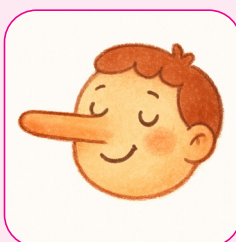

Nouns

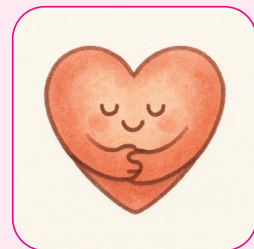


Light

Feeling alone



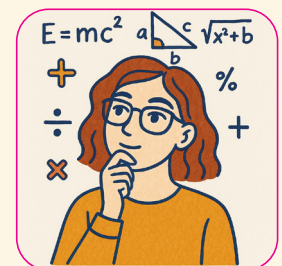
