


### Vocabulary Puss in Boots




# Teacher's Introduction

This vocabulary guide is designed to support the language learning objectives of students in 5th and 6th grade (Third Cycle of Primary Education) as they engage with the theatrical production Puss in Boots. It includes a curated selection of essential vocabulary items that appear throughout the play, organized by grammatical category: proper nouns, nouns, adjectives, and verbs.

Each word is accompanied by a clear, student-friendly definition in English to support comprehension and classroom use. Proper nouns are listed without definitions, as they refer to characters or places specific to the story.

#### This resource can be used to:

- Pre-teach key terms before viewing the play
- Reinforce vocabulary during post-show discussions and written tasks
- Support grammar-focused activities (e.g., verb tense practice, adjective comparison, noun recognition)
- Provide a basis for flashcards, games, or mini-assessments
- Scaffold writing and speaking tasks related to the characters and plot





We encourage you to use the vocabulary audio track provided with this guide. It can help students hear and repeat the correct pronunciation of the words, reinforcing listening and speaking skills in a natural, engaging way. Listening to the words aloud will also support students with different learning styles, including auditory and kinesthetic learners.

Teachers are invited to adapt this vocabulary list to the specific needs of their students. For example, you might highlight 10–12 target words for active focus, create personalized glossaries, or ask students to translate and illustrate key terms in their notebooks.


This glossary aligns with curriculum goals related to vocabulary acquisition, use of language in context, and cultural understanding through literature and drama.






